











Chain Ring Instructions

It all began in the Middle East, a land of mystery and intrigue, with Sheiks, who while riding gaily decorated camels and spirited horses, ruled the desert with golden sceptres and gilded swords. This was the birthplace of the famed puzzle rings. Centuries ago these puzzle rings served as wedding bands, and were worn by women of nomadic tribes. The husband held the secrets of the rings. This guaranteed his wife's faithfulness, for the ring once removed from her fingers would fall apart.

 <p>1. Find end band which is flat on one side and rounded on the other</p>	 <p>2. Hold end band with rounded side by your thumb and the flat part by your forefinger in your right hand.</p>	 <p>3. Bring next band up and fit two notches together then fold bands down.</p>	 <p>4. They should fit together. The bands may not fit perfectly as you have the next band between them. Note the open loop.</p>	 <p>5. Bring next band up towards you fitting into open loop.</p>
 <p>6. Then flip band over till the notches fit into one another.</p>	 <p>7. Bring it down and into place.</p>	 <p>8. Bring the last band up fitting the two notches together.</p>	 <p>9. Bring the band down into place. If your ring has more than 4 bands you need to repeat from step 3 until you have completed the ring.</p>	 <p>10. Congratulations, you have assembled your ring.</p>
